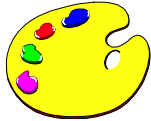


## ♪ MUSIC PROGRAM ♪

## Our Preschool Day

When the children enter the classroom, their teacher will greet them. The children wash their hands, check in by posting their name card, and then they are free to explore the various learning activities and interest centers that have been prepared before their arrival.



### Kid's Stuff

Paint, water, play dough, collage materials, sensory tubs, floor toys, music, puppets, construction blocks, books, puzzles, dolls to love, suitcases to pack. Special things for special days.

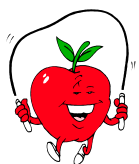


### Circle Time

From learning and interest centers we move to circle time, which includes conversations, stories, finger plays, singing, calendar and graphing activities, and sharing time.

### Snack Time

Our preschool families on a rotating basis provide nutritional snacks. We all look forward to this special time of snacking, giggling, and conversation.



### Gross Motor Play

We are very fortunate to have a beautiful playground, which provides many opportunities to develop your child's large motor skills and coordination.

On rainy days we use Simpson Hall for indoor gross motor activities. We have Ketcars, tricycles, scooter boards, basketball hoops, balls, hoppy balls, floor puzzles and hula-hoops.

## Our Pre-Kindergarten

This afternoon program has been designed to provide either a 3 or 5-day class for the 4-5 year old child. The Mon/Weds/Friday portion provides the same program as its morning counterpart, including Music on Wednesday afternoons.

A child may register for the Tues/Thursday segment, too, which emphasizes additional math, science, art, and language activities in a smaller group of only 8 children. These additional 2 days enables our teacher to provide additional learning experiences prepared to encourage the children to think, reason, question and experiment, while encouraging language and literacy development.



## Our Kindergarten

Our afternoon kindergarten program addresses the whole child in all aspects of development. The class is small so that we can provide learning experiences that respond to individual differences in ability and interests. Small group learning provides opportunities for children to collaborate and cooperate during projects and play.



Our kindergarten program provides a variety of developmentally appropriate activities and materials that are selected to emphasize concrete experiential learning. We use *Bridges Mathematics-Kindergarten*. The children develop solid mathematical foundations as they delve deeper into concept-oriented games and work together to solve problems.



Good Sam's goal for reading and writing in Kindergarten is to have all children beginning to read and write on their own by the end of the year. Fun trips outside to the *Bookmobile* are a highly anticipated weekly experience for all.
