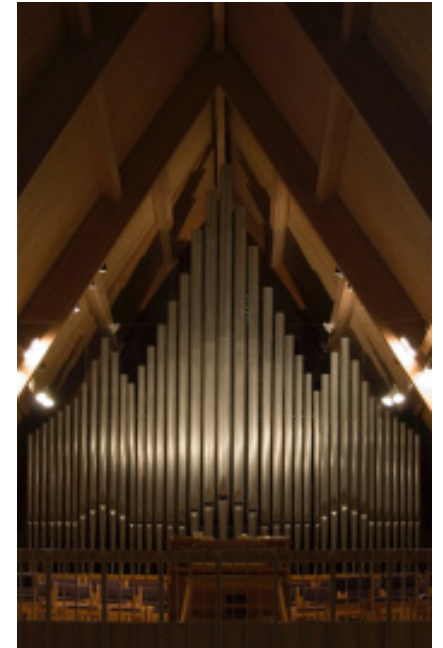

The program will feature many settings by various composers of canticles, or songs, contained within the Scriptures.

Aage Nielsen and Jennifer Drake

The Darkwood Consort of Boise, Idaho will present music of Danish composers. Featuring Aage Nielsen on bass clarinet and Jennifer Drake on viola, they are often joined by other performers. Compositions by Finn Hoffding, Jorgen Bentzon, Jan Maegaard and others will be performed. Also, Danish folk songs such as "Smedens Anders Skottisch," "Polska fra Fyn" and more will be included.

Andrew Todd, piano

Pianist Andrew Todd of Aspen, Colorado received his Doctorate of Musical Arts from the University of Colorado in Boulder, where he was a student of David Korevaar. With degrees also from Northwestern University and the Mannes College of Music, Dr. Todd has performed throughout the United States. In competitions he has won the Artists International Piano Award and the Notes at 9,000: Emerging Artists Series held in Winter Park, Colorado.

Lessons and Carols: Sing of Mary

Good Samaritan Choir

This service, based on the liturgy performed every year at King's College, Cambridge, will include many carols, hymns and canticles in honor of the Virgin Mary. The Good Samaritan Choir, directed by Dr. Ward Scott, will perform the selections, and additional local musicians and performers will be included.

Music for a Cathedral

Marko Petricic, organ

Dr. Marko Petricic is the assistant organist and choirmaster at Christ Church Cathedral in Indianapolis, Indiana. He holds the Doctoral of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees from Indiana University, where he studied with Christopher Young. He also has studied with H. Joseph Butler at Ohio University. In addition to the organ, Marko is an accomplished bayan-accordion performer, and his bayan talents have won awards at international competitions in Italy, Germany, Yugoslavia and the United States.

Sunday, February 11 (Second Sunday)

Second Annual Children's Concert

Con Grazia Wind Quintet (Simpson Hall)

Formed in 1995 by wind players of the Oregon Chamber Players, the quintet will perform a concert of music geared to educating children about instrumental music. The interactive presentation will feature the stories of Beatrix Potter. The instruments include the flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon and horn. All ages are invited, and children under age 10 should be accompanied by an adult.

Sunday, March 25

Annual Bach Birthday Celebration

Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) was one of the greatest figures of Western art music. His life and work synthesized the ideals of the Baroque music era into a form not reached by his contemporaries. With musicians from the Corvallis area, his music will be performed: some in its original form, some in transcriptions and adaptations.

Sunday, April 22

"The Great American Songbook"

Palmer Lavin Duo

The Palmer Lavin Duo will play classic jazz interpretations from the "Great American Songbook" in a relaxed, conversational style augmented with hot jazz improvised solos, and rich emotional stylings. The music is presented with guitar and voice, and other combinations, including upright bass and piano. They will play a mix of well-known tunes by Duke Ellington, Hoagy Carmichael, Jimmy VanHeusen, Jerome Kern and others.

Sunday, May 20 (Third Sunday)

Service of Thanksgiving and Remembrance
